- Do you live in a multicultural country?
- Have you ever visited a multicultural city? If so, what identified the city as being multicultural? What were your impressions?
- What are the benefits of multiculturalism?
- Can you think of any negatives of multiculturalism?
- Do you think it is possible for a multicultural city to retain its national identity?
- The Prime Minister of Britain recently said that multiculturalism had failed in Britain because different cultures were segregated within the country and not mixing. How could this problem be solved?
- Why do you think some country's leaders do not want their nation to become multicultural?
- Can you think of a city or country where multiculturalism works successfully?
- Is multiculturalism good for world peace and understanding?
- Some schools adopt multicultural education where the children are taught about the practices and traditions of different cultures. What are the benefits of such an education?
- When immigrants arrive in a new country, do you think they should be required to learn the language of that country? Why / Why not?
- Should countries offer special programs to immigrants to help them adapt in their new country. What do you think such programs should include?
- Can multiculturalism result in a country losing its identity?
- Do you think the whole world will eventually become a 'melting pot' of different races and cultures?
- Have you ever witnessed an example of discrimination?
- Have you visited any country that you felt was very different from your own? What did you find that was very strange to you?

- Do you think that your family is tolerant enough to other cultures and their customs?
- Which aspects of life in your country do you think might seem strange or unusual to a first-time foreign visitor? You can consider the following areas: food, celebrations, attitude to work and means of transport.
- What are your dreams about your future partner? Do you think you are tolerant enough to other cultures, races and religion?
